In order to find the progenitor of nearly all of the House line who live in or have descended from the Mohawk valley families we must go back to the period 1708 - 1709. Among the Palatinate refugees who came from England to America with the Rev. Joshua Kocherthal was one Christian Hauss. We find also in the church records of the Rev. Kocherthal the following: Married Sept. 27, 1710 Christian Hauss, widower, a carpenter of Alten-Staden, near Welglar in the ducy of Solms, to Anna Catherine, widow of the late Johann Becker of Durnberg, near Beitz in the sovereignty of Schomberg. It is supposed that Christian Hauss' first wife as well as Johann Becker died on the voyage over or soon after reaching these shores, as history of that period tells us that sickness and privations took many lives both on the voyage over and the winter following. In the census of 1713 - 1714 is shown that Christian Hauss and wife Maria Catharina together with eight children are living at New-Heesburg on the Hudson river. It can be easily seen that most of these children were by the first wife and bears out a tradition in the House family that six brothers came from England to America together. The names of these six sons of Christian House will be given later in this writing. There is a record of Christian Houys being naturalized Oct. 11, 1715. At the present time I have been unable to learn whether Christian Hauss left any children by his second marriage and we are sorry to say we have been unable as yet to find a record of the name of his first wife, the mother of the children he brought to America with him.

In Governor Hunter's list of Palatinates who received assistance (ration list) was the name of John Christian Haus identical with the Christian Haus mentioned above as the surnames John and Christian many times coupled together have come down thru the generations. In the year 1725 on Aug. 26, we find in the Albany County records a transfer executed by Harmonas Wendell of a parcel of land, being a part of Harrison's Patent and lying near the mouth of Little Canada Creek to Christian Haus and Hendrick Clack, Albany County deeds, Book 7, page 87 etc. The record of this transaction was sent me by Mrs. J.A. Venable of 1424 Iroquois Avenue, Detroit, Mich. and was taken from the St. Johnsville Reformed Church book. Of course Christian Hauss may and probably did have children by his second wife as we have drawn from the records the names of six sons and two daughters, with the name of one other male whom we have been unable to place. The names of these six sons are as follows: Reinhard, Johannes, George, Herman or Harmonas, Conrad and Peter. The two girls were named Maria Margaretha and Elizabeth. There is also a male named Elias who is mentioned as follows:

Harmon Van Slyke Patent, map of tract of land granted to Harmon Van Slyke by letters patent dated Sept. 1, 1716 given to 32 persons of whom No. 23 was Elias House. Elias may have been one of the first six and Peter by the second marriage, but we have no proof at present that Elias was a son of Christian but from the early date of the above transaction we might safely say that he was.

Reinhard married Anna Elizabeth..... and we find a record of two children, Johann Henrick born Nov. 5, 1715 at Yonkers, N.Y.; Christian born Aug. 2, 1722 at Tappan, N.Y. A Johannes Haus was naturalized Aug. 27, 1721 and we have no further record of him at present. Neither have we any record of Harman, Conrad and Peter but know that from the Hudson the Palatines emigrated to other

points, some to Connecticut, some to Pennsylvania and some to other parts so it is fair to assume that the Houses in these several sections all sprang from this one parent stock.

The branch of the family in whom we are most interested were those who journeyed up the Hudson, went along the Mohawk until they reached the settlement in what is usually termed the Mohawk Valleys. The first Christian Hauss, son of George married Maria Catherine Eckert and is the ancestor of the family of the writer of this article and their history will be taken up in a later writing. Of the two girls we find that Maria Margretha was born in Ohren, Ilsteiner Land in 1686 and according to our genealogist married Peter Wagner, born Oct. 4, 1687. They had seven children born in America including Col. Peter Wagner of Palatine, N.Y. Elizabeth married Conrad Rickert. No further record of her. We would be glad if any of our readers could give further record of any of the above.

It is a little confusing to connect up the genealogical lines from the time the Palatinate came to America to the time of the American Revolution as the records are incomplete, and during that period the families and different branches thereof moved to other localities and settled and it is necessary to study the church records of their different localities in order to do so and again the different branches of families used the same names for their children and at times we may find several Georges or other given names attached to one surname and perhaps all of about the same age and in the same locality, as the sons and daughters were generally sponsored by the grandparents or a brother or sister and sometimes by a neighbor or friends and given the name of the sponsor and in that way the name is spread throughout the family.

It is to be assumed that the children who came to America with Christian Hauss soon became of marriageable age which was very young at that period and made homes for themselves. Christian Hauss and some of these children soon reached the Mohawk valley and others settled elsewhere and before following him up the Mohawk we will list some records as found along the Hudson river and in Schoharie county.

children, Johan George and Conrad, twins, born July 7,
1729;
sponsors, George Zimer, Johannes Layer (Lawyer), Maria
Eliza Zimer and Elizabeth Layer.

Also the following:

child Anna Eva born Sept. 15, 1731, baptized in Schoharie

sponsors, William Fox and wife.

Parents, Conrad Rickert and Elizabeth Haus;
child, Elizabeth, born March 19, 1733;
sponsors, Johannes Layer and Elizabeth Schaffer.

Parents, George Hauss and wife Maria Catherina;
child, Maria Elizabeth, baptized Oct. 30, 1734;
sponsors, Maria Elizabeth and Herman Haus.

Parents, Jurrian Haus and wife Catherine Earhart;
child, Maria Dorothea, baptized Jan. 7, 1736;
sponsors, Hendrick Kneeskern and Maria Dorothea Warner.

Parents, Jurrian Haus and Catherine Earhart;
child, Johan George, baptized Nov. 8, 1737;

The names Jurrian and Jurria are George. We find no House
record at Schoharie after 1737.

The Stone Arabia Reformed church:

Married Jan. 20, 1761 George House, George House's single
son to Maria, James Gamals single
daughter.

Our line of the House family as we believe prior to the
American Revolution although we are lacking in some church records
is as follows:

Christian (1) and first wife, name unknown.
George (2) and Maria Catherine Ecker.
Conrad (3) and Engelga.
Johnathan (4) and Lena Van Slyke.

We believe from our studies that the above George and Conrad
both took part in the Revolutionary war. Conrad and his wife
Engelga was the parents of a large family and at the time of his
death was living near Schuyler Lake. He had several sons and
many took part in the war. Three are prominently mentioned as
living on the south side of the Mohawk river in the town of Cana-

Joharie and vicinity after the war, namely Johnathan, Nicholas and George. Johnathan lived at Indian Castle during the war. Besides the three mentioned above there was one brother Harmanas who was a Tory. We have good reason to believe that Capt. Christian House was also a brother of those mentioned above.

Johnathan, Nicholas and George were all members of Capt. Jost Dygert's company in Col. Clyde's regiment of 1st Canajoharie Militia. Whether all were present at the Battle of Oriskany we do not know, but we do know that Johnathan was present at that battle and assisted in placing General Herkimer on the saddle under the beech tree after the General was mortally wounded, and from which position he directed the battle. We have affidavit that he made that claim. It has always been tradition in our family and our genealogist says there is no doubt of the truth of his claim as history shows that John House was a private in the company of Jost Dygert who was in command of General Nicholas Herkimer's front guard in the battle of Oriskany and would have been in a position to be near the General when he fell. The military service of John House has been accepted by the Daughters of the American Revolution and he believes that all members of Capt. Jost Dygert's company are entitled to have their names placed upon the Oriskany monument.

History also shows that Johnathan, Nicholas and George were all at some period made prisoners of war.

In Governor Clinton's papers reference is made to the capture of John House by Brandt and his subsequent release and the service he did the colonies at that time. This will be taken up in a later writing. The House family was very large and that it was very patriotic is shown by the fact that in the Revolutionary records we find the name mentioned over sixty times. Of course there were not that many who took part, as many re-enlisted several times as emergency presented itself and their service was needed. Further service of the House family will follow.

Since writing my last installment of the House family I have discovered in my files the following early records Schoharie Reformed Church, October 18, 1732:

Parents, Lambert Stearnberg and Catherine Feller;
child, Christina;
sponsors, Coonraad Haus and Christina Walraad.

Stone Arabia Lutheran Church:

Parents, Johannes Mehr and wife Christina;
child, Coonrad;
sponsors, Coonraad Haus and Engelga his wife.

In the Rev. Sommers Register of baptisms performed at Cani-Schohare and Stein Raby 1743-1750 was published in the Enterprise and News of Dec. 20, 1931 is the following:

A little girl of Herman Haus baptized Oct. 1, 1749.

A little girl of Jurgen Haus baptized Oct. 9, 1749.

Without doubt the same Harman Haus and Jerrie Haus mentioned in Schoharie church records in or about 1737. They coming to the Mohawk soon after 1737. We also find a Hans George Haus and wife Sophia sponsors for Johan George Rasner, born April 17, 1755, a son of Johan George Rosner and Maria Catherina Wagner his wife. We also find an Anna Elizabeth Haus named as sponsor for Catherine Elizabeth Wagner Sept. 10, 1718, a daughter of Peter Wagner and his wife Anna Margaret. Peter Wagner and Anna Margaret Haus were

also sponsors at the baptism of a daughter to George Saltsman and Catharine Elizabeth Wagner. Again we find Peter Haus and Barbara Krantz as sponsors at the birth of Peter Saltsman Feb. 8, 1758.

We have also other records which show the Wagner and House families very closely connected down through the early church records and our genealogist Mr. Frank D. Deuel says, "there seems to be no doubt that Peter Wagner's wife was Maria Catharine Haus instead of Maria Catharine Loucks, the error taking place in misinterpreting the spelling of that period." Personally I am unacquainted with the Wagner genealogy and am making no attempt to discredit any records or claims they may have but feel that Mr. Deuel has good grounds for the position he takes.

We will now leave the early history of the House family and take up the war record of Johnathan, one of the brothers mentioned in a former article.

In a list of Capt. Jost Dygert's company in Col. Clyde's Regiment under payroll certificate No. 11199 as published in the Enterprise and News of May 1st, 1929 we find the name of John House, private.

Also see "New York State Revolutionary War Manuscripts." John House was a private in the company of Capt. Jost Dygert who was in command of General Nicholas Herkimer's front guard in the battle of Oriskany Aug. 6, 1777 as per Jost Dygert's pension papers. John House listed as private in a company of Tryon County Rangers. Also public papers of George Clinton Vol. 5, page 188. Also private in a company of Tryon County Militia by Col. Campbell & Col. Fox.

General Sullivan's Expedition, Camp Jacunas Farm, twenty miles by land from Lake Otsego Aug. 10, 1779. I enclose an account given me by a certain John House who was brought into camp by one of my scouts the day before I left the lake. This information I am inclined to credit as the particulars are chiefly confirmed by Col. Klock in a letter dated the 7th inst. "By James Clinton to George Clinton."

Volume 5, page 189-190.

"Deposition of John House."

John House in account given by himself saith, That on the 2nd instant he was taken prisoner by Joseph Brandt and a party of twelve Indians and Tories who conveyed him some miles into the woods when Brandt and four Indians went off lofting him in charge of the others, and after an absence of about four days they returned bringing Brandt on horse back, wounded in the ball of the great toe by a swan shot; That a bullet and several swan shot had passed through his coat and breech clout; That he understood from one of the Tories they had made an attack upon some of the inhabitants of the Mohawk river near the Little Falls where the said House lived; That they had taken one prisoner whom being closely persued they killed and narrowly escaped with the loss of their blankets and plunder, that even after they discovered a party of our people which put them to flight; but House being lame by being tyed at night and marching without shoes, which with the greater part of his clothing they took from him they determined to kill him, but being an acquaintance of Butler's he was permitted to return after taking the oath of neutrality, a certificate of which Brandt gave him written in the Indian language, signed by himself; that they also informed said House that they lately came from Minesiuk where they had an action with our people and in which they took about thirty four prisoners, among whom were some officers and killed several; that they then proceeded to the river, where they carried on the second inst. the day they took House, which was about twelve days from the action at Minesiuk.

It is also stated that information which House gave Brandt regarding the strength and manuevers of our people prevented an attack by Brandt and the Tories upon Clinton's army.

Page 269 "The Old New York Frontier" by Frances Whitney Halsey.

"Brandt's letter adds that on reaching Oghwaga he learned that Gen'l Sullivan perhaps by this time may be at Shimong where I have sent my party to remain until I join them." He himself was just setting out with eight men for the Mohawk river in order to discover the enemy's motions.

General Clinton was still at the foot of Otsego lake with ten days longer to remain. Brandt proceeded up the Unadilla river to the Mohawk where they captured a man named John House.

House became lame from marching and the Indians prepared to kill him, but Brandt ordered that he be released on a promise of neutrality. One of General Clinton's scouts afterwards found House and the day before the departure from the lake, brought him into camp. House had particulars of the threatened invasion from Canada by the way of Buck Island. Fort Schuyler was to be attacked. From John House further activities in the Revolution it would not seem that he took his oath of neutrality seriously.

I will not dwell here longer on John House's Revolutionary record, but will pass on to a later period in history and take up his further military activities.

"Council of Appointments" New York State Military Records, years 1784-1821.

Page 795, year 1805 -- John House appointed Ensign, Vice John J. Fealing appointed Captain, Vice Coonrad Helager moved.

Montgomery County 1805, Lt. Col. Andrew Gray's Regiment.

In the same publication page 1182, Vol. 2, year 1811. Ensign John House appointed Lieutenant Vice, John J. Klock resigned.

Page 1327, Vol. 2, year 1812, Lieutenant John House promoted to captain in Lieutenant Jacob Snell's Regiment, Brigade commanded by Brig. Gen. Richard Dodge.

Page 1480, Vol. _____ year 1814.

Captain John House resigned and Thomas Wilbur appointed, Nineteenth Regiment, Andrew Zabriske, Lt. Col., Vice Jacob Snell appointed Sheriff.

Captain John House as we must now call him and as he has always been called down through the history and tradition of the family had a long and honorable military career, during the American Revolution. The war of 1812 and as a training officer of the militia. Tradition says that he was about seven feet in height and that when any trouble arose among his men in training, he merely laid his hand upon their heads and said boys be quiet and the trouble stopped. The genealogical history of John House will be taken up in a later writing.

For the benefit of those who did not read the first chapter of the House family history I will give the heads of each generation in America until the time of the Revolution. First Christian Haus who emigrated from Germany via England in 1708-1709. In 1710 married Anna Catharine widow of Johann Becker.

Second George Haus and Maria Catharine Ecker.

Third Conrad House and Engelge.

Fourth John House and Lena Van Slyke.

John House was born about the year 1760. The exact date is unknown as we have been unable to find as yet the baptismal records of the children of Conrad House and wife Engelge. But we do know that in the year 1822 John House visited his son Abraham at Parish, Oswego county and at that time gave his age as sixty two years. As to the brothers and sisters of John we can quote the following as positive. Nicholas who married Catharine Spohn. George who married Maria Mable. Harmonas a Tory who is referred to on page 177, Vol. 2 Frontiersmen of New York by J.R. Simms. Lea who married John Kelly of Canajoharie Castle. Catharina who married James Woodard. Captain Christian House was undoubtedly a brother as he lived near the other sons of Conrad and Conrad and Engelge are mentioned as sponsors at the birth of some of Captain Christian House's children, one of whom was named Conrad. There were without doubt others whom we have been unable to place at present. Conrad House and wife together with James Woodard and wife are mentioned in the census of 1790, page 106 as living at Schuyler Lake in the town of German Flatts. These two families were either living together or on adjoining property.

James Woodard and Catharine House had a daughter Angeligne baptized in 1790 with Conrad House and wife Angeligne as sponsors. John Kelly and wife Lea House had a daughter Angel baptized in 1792 with Conrad House and wife Angel as sponsors.

In the above three records the name of the wife of Conrad House is spelled in three different ways and shows what a genealogist is up against in trying to identify the different branches of families. John Kelly and wife Lea had a daughter Maria baptized July 2, 1793. George House and wife Maria Sponsors.

The census of 1790 gives Johnathan, Nicholas and George as living at Indian Castle which was on the south side of the Mohawk river between Little Falls and St. Johnsville. Who Harmonas married we do not know for sure but believe his wife to have been Margreth. History and family tradition say he was a Tory and John House often mentioned him with regret. The census of 1790 mentions as neighbors of the House's at or near Indian Castle the Mables, Walraths, Herkimers, etc. That the Houses and Herkimers were great friends is shown by records of that time. In a letter from the Hon. F. W. Cristman he says that George House was a witness to the will of General Nicholas Herkimer.

One of John's sons was named for and sponsored by Abraham Herkimer, a son of Henry who was a brother of Nicholas. Catharine Rosencrantz, a daughter of the Rev. Abraham Rosencrantz was also a sponsor.

We have been unable to find a record of the marriage of John House and Lena Van Slyke as the records between 1771 and 1787 seem to be very few and some records of about that period were destroyed by raids, but we know it was about 1778. Of the children of John House and his wife Lena we have the following:

Rev. Abraham Rosencrantz, German Flatts Church record, Vol. 1 page 36.

Parents John House and Lena his wife.

Child John born August 1, 1779, baptized Sept. 1, 1779.
Sponsors John Van Slick and wife Margaret, Vol. 1, page 36.

Gerrit born January 24, 1782, baptized Feb. 6, 1782.
Sponsors Henrich Uhly and Engelge Van Slyck, Vol. 1, page 54.

Engelge born June 6, 1784, baptized June 13, 1784.
Sponsors Conrath Hauss and wife Engelge, Vol. 1, page 84.

Abraham born April 25, 1786, baptized May 1, 1786.
Sponsors Abraham Harkimer and Catharine Rosencrantz whose
mother was a sister of General Harkimer, Vol. 1,
page 108.

Twins names not given, born May 14, 1788.
Sponsors Johannes Smidt and George Hauss, Vol. 1, page 130.

From other records we have or by deduction, it is assumed that the names of these twins were George and Nicholas. Conrad born June 6, 1783 according to Bible record. Could find no church record of this or the following: Mary who married Benjamin Churchill and moved to Parish, Oswego county and there died in old age and is buried in the Bidwell cemetery leaving no children who lived to maturity.

Conrad married Betsey Hagard and also settled in Oswego county and is buried in the Bidwell cemetery. Abraham married Nancy Mable and moved from the Mohawk valley to Parish about the year 1817 bringing three children with them.

John House was married a second time. His second wife's first name was Rhoda. Last name unknown. By this second marriage he had the following children of record. Solomon, wife's name unknown by me. Johnathan married Matilda Hoke, Nancy married William Bonesteel and Ebenezer who died Nov. 11, 1862 aged 62 years, 5 months and 19 days.

It was with this Ebenezer that John lived at the time of his death. His wife was Eve Starrin. These last all settled in Otsego and many of their descendants are there now living. In his later years Captain John House took up a tract of land on what is called "Twelve Thousand" near Richfield Springs. The title to the land could not be obtained until after the death of one of the heirs. Capt. John died and is buried in a private cemetery on the farm where he died. The title to the farm was finally given to the son Ebenezer. The transfer of title was given in 1831 to Ebenezer House who had occupied the farm for some time. One of Captain John House's great grandsons has made affidavit to the location of the grave which he saw many times when a boy but the markers have been obliterated by time.

Many stories are extant regarding the life and doings of Capt. John House. These traditions have come down through the generation for over one hundred years and many have been lost by the wayside, but others have been handed from mouth to ear and from generation to generation until the present day.

Among these is the following as given to me by one of his great grandsons Howard H. House of Richfield Springs. "In the early days of the settlement of twelve thousand or McCormack's Patent (afterwards called Coopers Patent) and lies between Lakes Canadaga and Otsego. John House was one of the first to settle in the northern part of the present town of Otsego.

He at one time saved the life of an Indian (name unknown) who afterwards was a firm friend of John's. They hunted and trapped together and the Indian lived with John till his death. At one time they were carrying a deer home through the woodland now on Charles Rose's farm when it became dark and they found themselves surrounded by wolves so they placed their backs to a large tree and stayed there until morning, then carried home the deer as the wolves left at daylight.

Again he says this Indian knew of some places where he could get lead for their bullets. He would take John to a certain tree

and then he would go out of sight and after a time would return with his buckskin shirt filled with chunks of lead which he had cut off with his knife, then dividing the load they would carry it home. There seemed to be an understanding of honor between them that the location of the lead should remain a secret.

And again he tells that at one time they discovered a bee tree which they robbed, the Indian refusing to leave until they obtained all of the honey although stung so badly that he could not see and John had to lead him home. Capt. John House was a very religious man and one night when his family returned home from attending a gathering at a neighbor's they found him kneeling at his bedside in an attitude of prayer, but his spirit had flown. Thus he died in the year 1824.

In this writing we want to take up a little more definitely the children of Captain John House. As we have not a complete record of whom they all married and where they settled, we wish at this time to invite comments, and any information that can be given by your readers concerning the House family through the columns of the Enterprise and News or by direct letter to me and such information will be given due notice through the columns of this paper. The first child born to John Howe and Lena Van Slyke was named John and undoubtedly died in infancy as we find no record of him except of his baptism.

Gerrit born January 24, 1782 was often spoken of by the older members of the family as Uncle Gerrit but those older ones have now passed on and we have no record of whom he married or where he made his home.

Of Engelge, Dorothea and Peter we have little or no record but we have good reason to believe that Peter at one time lived in the town of Columbia.

George (wife's name unknown) lived in South Columbia and Nicholas settled in West Amboy, Oswego Co. and some of his descendants are now there living.

Conrad, born June 6, 1783 married Betsey Hazard and had the following children who lived to maturity:

Lana married Amasa Robertson, lived in Chicago at the time of the fire in 1871 and as she was never heard from afterwards it is supposed that she perished in the fire. James was married twice and after his second marriage moved to Iowa and later to Nebraska where he died. Nancy married Caleph Sherman. Lived in Parish, N.Y. John married Miranda Hall and had the following, James who died as a young man and Anthony, Aaron and Nettie now living at or near Morrisville, N.Y. Alexander married Julia Miller, lived in Parish, had one daughter Ada.

Abraham married Catharine Mowers and also settled in Parish. Their children were Emily Pitcher, Mary Malitta, James Wallington, Dollie A., Ella L., Edwin C., Eliza A., Peter and Allen.

Abraham, another son of John House and Lena Van Slyke married Nancy Hannah Mable a daughter of David Mable and Nancy Freymeyer who is said to have lived near Stone Arabia. A David Mable was in Captain Jost Dygert's company in Col. Clyde's regiment. Was it the same man. We are very anxious to obtain further information regarding this Mable line. Abraham House and Nancy Mable were parents of the following: Andrew who married Elizabeth Scriber. Elizabeth Scriber's mother was a Mary Walrod or Walrath. Her father was Philip Scriber. We think from information we have that Mary Walrod was a daughter of Henry Walradt whose affidavit was published in the Enterprise and News of May 1, 1929. Can any one give further light on this. Other children of Abraham House and Nancy Mable are, Philona Hannah, died in infancy; Joseph (wife's name unknown); David married Sophia Pierce; Simon married Pamela Rowe; Caroline married first Amos Martin, second George Sherman; Abraham married first wife name unknown, second wife Mary Orr; Alonzo married Maria House; Leonard married Catherine Westover; Norman went to Chile, So. America and there married and died; Conrad married Sarah Robinson; Emily married Philip Westover. All of these children except Norman settled in Oswego county. As mentioned in a previous article John and Lena had a daughter Mary who married a Benjamin Churchill and lived in Oswego county. Captain John House and second wife Rhoda had the following children, Solomon, Johnathan, Nancy and Ebenezer. Solomon (wife's name unknown) operated a fleet of boats on the Erie canal. He had children, Wilson and Harriet. Wilson lived in Frankfort or Ilion. No trace of Harriet. Johnathan married Matilda Hoke. Had children Delavan, Hiram and Ann and lived near six mile point, (Otsego Lake). Delavan's son Fred was a criminal lawyer in New York city. Nancy married William Bonesteel. Had children Caroline, Irene and Philander of whom we have no trace. Ebenezer married Eve Starrin and had the following children, Caroline and Lester, died young.

Alonzo, born July 23, 1832 died 1911, has grandson Homer House living near Rome, N.Y. and also a grandson Jerome living at West Winfield. Joel at one time lived in Camden, N.Y. No living descendants. Menzo, no living descendants. Sarah married first husband was named Miner and they had one son Leroy. Her second husband was Henry Hoke and they had son Alvin.

Katherine, no children. Herman married Alice Margaret Taylor. They had Howard now living near Richfield Springs. J. Taylor now deceased left two daughters Alice and Katherine and Katharine, Lavina, Harvey J. Would be glad to have any information on the above sent to M. R. Shaver, Ransomville, N.Y.

The House genealogy of the House family regarding the visit to Parish, Oswego county, 1822 is quite right. He also visited my great grand father John Marshall and Margrit Herkimer who were early settlers from Schuyler Lake. Many Mohawk families came to Parish vicinity about 1800-1822. John Marshall and Margrit Herkimer were great grandparents of my grandfather Marshall, the son of Margrit Herkimer and John Marshall has often spoken of the House family. I have his marriage certificate, 81 years old (1852), married Harriet L. Burrows of Orriskany. His father John Marshall and Margrit Herkimer moved from Otsego county, Schuyler Lake with one horse and wagon. The wagon was loaded with their possessions. My great grandmother rode the horse. My great grandfather walked the distance and led the horse.

NICHOLAS HOUSE LINE

I am quoting from information furnished me by Mrs. M.W. Hatch of Richfield Springs, N.Y., who has devoted much time and effort to the study of the Nicholas House line and we believe it was through her effort that his grave has been properly marked.

A number of families by the name of House were occupying homes south of the Mohawk before the Revolution but their relationship is not known. (The relationship has now been proven).

Nicholas House, born in 1769 married at Winden, Montgomery county, March 15, 1785 to Catherine Spohn (daughter of Nicholas Spohn and Elizabeth Devendorf.) Their home was the farm near Getmans Corners later owned by Newbern Myers. Tradition has it that he was a gentleman who wore a silk hat and rode about in a fine gig. He was an early veterinary. Their children were Nicholas, Jr., John Henry, Isaac, Jacob, George, Conrad, Anna Betsey, Susan Katy and Nancy. Nicholas House died July 1, 1829 in the 61st year of his age. He and his wife Catharine are both buried in the cemetery at Getmans Corners on the William Christman farm and both have headstones.

Regarding the war record of Nicholas House I will give herewith a copy of a letter from the Commissioner of Pensions, Washington, D.C. I am unable to say as to who this letter was addressed but it reads as follows:

Department of the Interior, Bureau of Pensions, Washington, D.C.

April 4, 1904.

Sir: In reply to your request for a statement of the military history of Nicholas House a soldier of the Revolutionary war you will find below the desired information as contained in his (or his widow's) application for a pension on file in this bureau. There is no definite statement of service. The comptroller of the state of New York shows payment to him for time he was a prisoner of war in Canada from August 1, 1781 to May 21, 1783. He belonged to Col. Clyde's New York troops. No other evidence of service. Battles engaged in. None mentioned. Residence of soldier at enlistment Montgomery county. Date of application for pension by John House a son, February 5, 1846. Residence at date of application of John House, Columbia, N.Y.

Age at application of John House fifty five years. Remarks, Soldier Nicholas House married Catherine Spoon March 15, 1785 at Minden, N.Y. and died July 1, 1829. His wife died November 24, 1842. Pension was granted to children John George, Nicholas, Jacob, Conrad, Henry, Isaac and Anna House and Elizabeth Van Alstine, Susannah Woodard and Nancy Vrooman.

The children of Nicholas House and Catherine Spoon are as follows:

George born Feb. 26, 1787.
Conrad and Nicholas, Jr., twins, baptized Nov. 9, 1788.
Johannes and Catherine, twins, baptized Sept. 21, 1790.
Susannah born Nov. 17, 1793.
Henry born Oct. 25, 1794.
Jacob born March 7, 1796.
Isaac born June 2, 1801.
Nancy born Oct. 13, 1802.
Elizabeth born August 17, 1817.
Anne born March 18, 1818.

It would seem that there must be some error in either the birth records of Elizabeth and Anna or in their parentage but all records I have at present show the record as published above to be true but I can hardly account for the space of time from 1802 to 1817 having no birth records. The birth and war records of Nicholas House show him to have been less than thirteen years old at the time of his capture. The date of enlistment is not given, but place of residence was and his age shows the very early age some of our patriot soldiers left their homes to do service for the colonies.

My next article will contain a record of the marriage of the children of Nicholas and Catherine House as well as some of the records of their children.

The children of Nicholas House, the brother of Jonathan and George and Catherine Spoon, his wife are as follows: Nicholas, Jr., John, Henry, Isaac, Jacob, George, Conrad, Anna, Betsy, Catherine and Nancy.

1. Nicholas, Jr. married Mary Snyder. Their children were Katharina (Single), Josiah, married Nancy Ray, Hiram married Nancy Fraunce, Nancy (Single), Christina married Erastus Smith of Little Falls and Jeremiah married a widow Sophie Humphrey. Nicholas Jr. died Aug. 8, 1871 aged 82 years, buried at Jordanville, N.Y.

2. John married Fannie Cheever. Their five children were Alfred, M.D., married Sarah Harris and went west. James married Cornelia Harris, lived in this Kingdom, had a son John House who married Alice Starkweather, lived west. James House died and Cornelia married Abraham Myers of Mohawk. Lucias House who married Velona Harris lived in the Kingdom, had a son Charley, Rosanna who married Peter Halmer and another married Dr. Hawks.

3. Henry married Maria Fikes and their eleven children were: Rhoda married John C. Miller, David married Mary Miller and second Angelina Spohn, Henry married Mary, Harvey married Eliza Tarpening who after his death married Damon Brown, Betsy married James Pierce and died two or three years after, Gaylord married Nancy Skinner, Lorenzo married Regina Tyler, Delos married Jane Gamwell, Sidney married first unknown and second Katharine Gale widow of Matthew Link, Margarette married William Getman and Martha married Delevan Armstrong.

4. Isaac, born June 2, 1801 died Dec. 25, 1884, married Elizabeth Miller, daughter of Peter Miller. Their daughter Caroline born Jan. 9, 1827 married James Woodford. Isaac married second Sarah Ames, daughter of Leonard Ames and Miss Ryder. The marriage was at the home of Ezra Cleland at Jordanville, N.Y. Sarah Ames lived with Ezra Cleland's family. They were married Jan. 2, 1831. Their children were Sanford born Oct. 28, 1831, died Aug. 6, 1870, Diadama born Jan. 10, 1833 died young, Abbie Catharine born Feb. 2, 1834 married Aufus Waldron. Isaac born May 12, 1837 died young. Daries died young. Squire born Dec. 4, 1838 married Cornelia Orendorf and second Mrs. Klock. Rodney born May 28, 1840 married Emily Staala. Harriet born March 4, 1842 married Hamilton Steel and a son Claude A. lives in Ilion at present. Melchar, born Mar. 18, 1846 died young. Matthew born Oct. 23, 1848 married Nancy Casler, died March 9, 1880. Dially Ann born Dec. 19, 1849 married Adrian Lewis, Aug. 7, 1867, second Adelmarr Paster.

5. George married Nancy Stroop and kept a hotel where Mrs. Maria Schuyler now lives and later built and lived in the house across the road, for many years the home of Joseph Holden Fox. Their thirteen children were Abraham who married Mary Bronson and among their children were Alonzo who married Emma Ingram.

Otis married Lana Miller, had a son Prof. Frank House. Otis married second Miss Underwood. He married a third time, lived at Oneida where he was killed crossing the railroad tracks. Mary-etta, daughter of Abram married Henry Balden. Frank married Benton Slade. Clara married George Wilkerson. Nancy married unknown. Seward married unknown. Bronson married Sarah Aldridge. Isaac the second child of George and Nancy married Betsy Thomas. Katy married Jacob Woleber and their children were Stephen, Dianthe and Charley. Harriet married Orlando Hoke. Chauncey married Mary Custin. Lafayette married Elizabeth Eggabroadt and their nine children were Norman married Elizabeth Harter, Orville married Adelaide Ackler, Charley married Fannie McCreedy, Jay S. married Ella Houghton Shepherd, Clayton married Eloise Jones, Fred married Emma Ward, George married Edna Wright, Delbert married Dora Cummings and Nellie who died young. Mary, daughter of George and Nancy married William Canfield. Diana married Daniel Hoke. Jane married Daniel Osterhout and Manuel died in the civil war. George House married second Betsy Thorp of Jordanville but they soon agreed to live apart. George and Nancy are buried in the Columbia cemetery.

6. Jacob married Katy, daughter of John Getman and Anne Elizabeth Frank who was a daughter of Timothy Frank and Anne Elizabeth Bellinger. Their one child, a daughter married Dr. Hawn. Katy died and Jacob married a second time but name of wife was accidentally destroyed by sheet of record being torn, although this record may be it. Jacob N. House born March 7, 1796 married widow Mary Jacques March 24, 1846. Their children were Charles Dudley, born May 19, 1847, Catharine Augusta born June 6, 1849. Elizabeth Hawn House born Aug. 27, 1851. Mary Anne Derthick born Jan. 25, 1808. Jacob N. House died Dec. 21, 1853. Catherine born 1849 married Melvin Shaul and Elizabeth born 1851 married Alvin Shaul and both had families. A Ralph W. Shaul lived in Sandy Creek, N.Y. in 1924 but have no record since then and do not know whether it was Melvin or Alvin was his father. Charlotte the daughter of Mary Jacques by her first marriage married William Petrie and they were the parents of Frank N. Petrie.

7. Conrad married first Lucinda Rounds and among their children born at the Round homestead in the Kingdom were Emeline married Monroe Wilkerson, Sophronia married Jefferson Green, Henry married Mary Miller, Conrad married second Katie Battles and third Susie Brown.

8. Anne married a man named Harter in Herkimer. No further record.

9. Betsy married George Van Alstine born 1778 and who died Dec. 10, 1856 (son of Martin Van Alstine). He was a soldier in the war of 1812. Among their descendants are the late Danforth Van Alstine and his son George Van Alstine, Archibald who died in his 98th year and left sons Frank and James Van Alstine in Ilion. George and Betsy are buried in the William Christman cemetery.

10. Susanna married John Woodard and had four children. He went west to buy a farm and never returned. Do not know what happened regarding him.

11. Katy or Catherine married John D., son of John Getman and Anne Elizabeth Frank (brother of Jacob House's wife). They had three children, Gaylord, Sophronia and another. Gaylord was father of Orrin, Andrew, Wellington, Clark, Mr. D. and Mrs. Orville Shaul. Sophronia married Jeremiah Myers and a son New-born Myers lived in Mohawk. Harris Myers and Mrs. George B. Getman of Ilion are grandchildren.

This record was compiled by Mrs. M.M. Hatch of Richfield Springs several years ago and the people named here are mostly dead, but as their descendants are mostly living in the valley I believe it will be of interest to them.

In this article I shall deviate before going further into the genealogy of the House family and give a roster of the members of the family who participated in the American Revolution. While this list is incomplete it is as I have been able to compile to date and is taken from different military records and perhaps it may be of interest and assistance to some one in their research work. I regret that the date at hand will not enable me to give the captain under which all the men and companies served as that is of great assistance in determining the locality from which they enlisted or were recruited.

The name of Conrad House which is not listed in any of the foregoing companies has been placed upon the Oriskany Monument as well as that of Captain Christian House and Lt. Jost House. Nelson Greene in his Story of Old Fort Plain says Lt. John Joseph House was taken prisoner at the Battle of Oriskany.

"New York in the Revolution," supplement page 118 mentions aid given to family of John House, family of 4, dated March 28, 1780, signed Christopher P. Yates, supervisor of Palatine District, County of Tryon.

"Public Papers of George Clinton" first governor of New York mentions among others prisoners taken near Fort Plank in Tryon county, Aug. 2, 1780.

Belonging to widow of Henry House Christiana age 16, Elizabeth age 11 and Conrad age 7.

Wife and children of Manyose House, Elizabeth 21, Christina 4, Jacobus 9 months. Also Elizabeth, daughter of George House and Conrad son of Adam House. Those prisoners were taken to Canada

in March, 1781 and on page 724-725 of Vol. 6 is an account of his demanding their return under threat of reprisal. "In the Story of Old Fort Plain" by Greene Lt. John Joseph House of Minden killed.

In Simms' "Frontiersmen of New York" Vol. 1 page 573-574 under title of Fort Plaink mention is made of Capt. Joseph House of military who was living with Plank and usually commanded the post in the absence of field officers. Facts from Lawrence Gros and Abraham House. The latter named was residing in 1846 on the old Plank farm, now owned (1882) by Adam Failing.

On wall of the Van Rensselaer club, Canajoharie, N.Y. number of days that the officers and men of my company have been on duty since the 8th day of July last, 1780 to the 28th of May, 1781. Those names appear, Captain Joseph House, Jost C. House, Pillerst Haus, Henrick Haus and Geo. Haus.

We also have copy of letter from Pension Department, Washington, D.C. giving war record of a Christian House (not Captain Christian) who served with Captain Jacob Siner's Reg. Capt. John Winn's, Capt. Robert McKean's, etc. which shows the number of enlistments some of the men made during the war. Would be glad of any data on any of the above mentioned that any of your readers may have. Also any correction or comment would be welcomed.

I regret that I have not gotten a more complete record of George House who is very closely linked in history with Johnathan and Nicholas whose genealogical history has been reviewed in my former articles. Records in the archives at Albany show that he was a member of Captain Jost Dygert's Canajoharie company in Col. Clyde's regiment. The records also show that he was made captive on January 9, 1781 and was held captive until August 4, 1782 and further stating that he was a member of Capt. Jost Dygert's company when taken. Whether he joined this company early enough in the war to have participated in the Battle of Oriskany I do not know.

George House married Maria Mayber as early as 1776 but we have no record of their marriage. They were sponsors in that year at the baptism of Johannes Schmidt.

The St. Johnsville Reformed church records of July 7, 1793, volume 1, page 81 show George House and wife Maria, sponsors at the baptism of Maria daughter of John Kelly and Lea House. In the Rev. Abraham Rosecrantz German Flatts Reformed church records, Vol. 1 page 90 is this record. George House and wife Maria had son Nicholas born December 3, 1784, baptized Dec. 5, 1784, Nicholas House and Dolly Maybee sponsors. In the same records, volume 1, page 116 George House and wife Maria had daughter Christina born Dec. 31, 1786, baptized January 2, 1787, sponsors Cobus Maybee and wife Christina.

St. Johnsville Reformed Church record, volume 1, page 7, George House of Canajoharie Castle and wife Maria Maybee had son Conrad baptized Dec. 14, 1788. Sponsors Bartholomess Mebie and Margretha Freymauer.

Volume 1, page 30 George House of Canajoharie Castle and wife Maria had daughter Anna baptized January 20, 1793. Sponsors David Hess and wife.

George House and Maria Maybee were also sponsors at baptism of Wilhelm Forbes, son of Nicholas Forbes November 13, 1781. Nicholas Forbes in census of 1790 is given as living at Indian

Falls. The census of 1790 shows George House living at Indian Castle or Canajoharie Castle as sometimes called, a near neighbor of his brothers Nicholas and Johnathan. In the same neighborhood lived the Herkimers and other prominent families of that period from whom have descended a long line of patriotic and influential citizens. George House was a witness to the will of General Nicholas Herkimer. We would be very pleased if any of the descendants of George House and Maria Maybee who may read this or any others who have any data as to other children they had or any information concerning them which has come down thru the generations would write me as I am very desirous of getting a more complete record.

We have been able to determine without any chance for contradiction the fact that Conrad and Engelge, his wife were the parents of Jonathan Nicholas, George and Harmonus House.

In this chapter we will take up another son of Conrad House and Engelge his wife. Our studies into the history of the different House lines has shown very clearly to me that Captain Christian House was also a brother of the four mentioned above. The Stone Arabia church records show that Christian Hauss and Christina Rightmeyer were married September 10, 1765. The Rev. Abraham Rosencrantz German Flatts Reformed Church records show that Conrad House and Engelga his wife were sponsors at the baptism of several of their grandchildren among whom were children of Jonathan Harmonus and Christian. In volume 1 page 27, they were sponsors at the baptism of Engelga, daughter of Harmonus House and wife Margretha. In volume 1 page 82 they were sponsors for Conrad son of Christian House and Christina his wife and on page 84 they were sponsors for Engelga, daughter of Jonathan House and Lena his wife. In many other church records we find the same families very closely connected. As to the family of Christian House and Christina his wife we have a very limited record as we have been disappointed in our correspondence with some of their descendants. In fact the correspondence was all on one side as I wrote some time ago enclosing stamp for reply as suggested in the columns of the Enterprise and News but so far have received no reply to my inquiry. In addition to Conrad mentioned above there was a John Christian who married Anna Bellinger. In a letter received from Mrs. W.E. Hayes of St. Johnsville January 28, 1930 she says, "My mother was Rosina House. She was a daughter of John Christian House who was a son of Capt. Christian House. John Christian House born Sept. 7, 1769 married to Anna Bellinger, born Oct. 22, 1772. They were married March 22, 1792. John Christian died April 13, 1853 and Anna his wife February 3, 1850. Their children were Henry born April 27, 1793, died Sept. 24, 1865. Anna born Sept. 11, 1795. Peggy born April 5, 1798. Christian born March 3, 1800. David born August 5, 1802. John J. born November 14, 1803, died July 24, 1872. Joseph born Sept. 2, 1806. Julianna April 10, 1809, died February 23, 1893, a daughter born in 1811 who died in infancy and Rosina born Jan. 7, 1815 and died January 11, 1877." Mrs. Hayes also states in her letter that in 1799 Capt. Christian House moved with his family on the farm where Nathan Cross now lives and followed farming. There is a record in the St. Johnsville Reformed Church dated January 17, 1790 showing the baptism of Catherine daughter of Christian House and Christina Rightmeyer of Youkers Bush. This daughter Catherine married Aaron Van Antwerp and a descendant of this couple now lives in Detroit, Mich, from one of whom, Mrs. J.A. Venable I have received valuable assistance in my research work. We have several letters from other members of the family who date back to Capt. Christian but who have not their records complete enough to be authentic. Mrs. Elizabeth Brothers of Gloversville is one as is also Mr. Roscoe House of Buffalo and brother Grant House of St. Louis, Mo. There is also many others

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of the Christian House line and we hope some day to have it more perfected. Again we invite added information or criticism.

Since my last installment of the House genealogy there has passed to their last reward two of the older members of the descendants of Jonathan House who has been mentioned in these articles

Addison S. House of 236 Jamesville Avenue, Syracuse, N.Y. was born November 15, 1851 and died April 10, 1933. In his early years he was an educator and was also possessed of high musical talent. On the evening of his death he was giving a Duddimes concert accompanied by his wife, before the Parent - Teachers association of the Roosevelt junior high school of Syracuse. At the conclusion of his part in the entertainment he took his seat in the auditorium and in a few minutes was taken with a severe heart attack and passed away about fifteen minutes after finishing his last concert. He was the son of Andrew House and Elizabeth Scriber of Parish, N.Y. who came there from Otsego county with Andrew's father Abraham about the year 1817. Abraham was the son of Jonathan. Addison S. House leaves to mourn his loss besides his wife Cora one son Earl of Syracuse and three daughters, Mrs. John Hoffenden and Mrs. Irving Hoffenden of Syracuse and Mrs. Blanche Skallinas of Chittenango. Mr. House was a member of the Rockefeller Methodist church of Syracuse from which the service was held. Burial at Williamstown, N.Y.

On Thursday, April 13, 1933 there passed away Mr. Homer House of Upper Floyd Avenue, Rome, N.Y. Mr. House had long been an honored resident of that community. He was the son of Alonzo House who was the son of Ebenezer who lived on twelve thousand near Richfield Springs. It was with this son Ebenezer that Jonathan House was living at the time of his death. Mr. House was nearly eighty years of age. He was united in marriage to a Miss Morrison of Williamstown, N.Y. who survives him. He is also survived by one brother Jerome of West Winfield, N.Y., one son Lowell and two daughters Mrs. Bessie Miller and Mrs. Frances Pastor all of Rome and several grandchildren. This closes my writings on the House genealogy for the present, hoping that further study will bring more interesting facts to light. In closing I want to thank those who have rendered assistance in procuring the information I have been able to give in these articles.

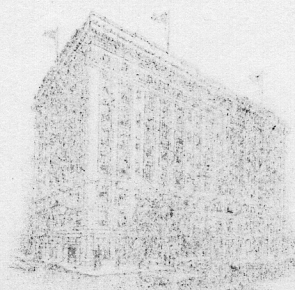

Roster of Oriskany Heroes

The list of names following comprise the combined lists of 1884 and 1921. There are duplicate names which may indicate two individuals and again it may be that two of the same name were engaged. Heretofore the 1884 list and the 1921 list have been published separately. In the following list they have been combined and classified for the sake of clarity.

The list also includes a number of names procured by Nelson Greene and others and which appeared in Greene's splendid work in four volumes entitled "The Mohawk Valley, Gateway to the West," published by the Clark Publishing Company, 1925. Other names have been added by individuals who have furnished satisfactory proof, many from the pension papers of the participants. To date this is the most comprehensive list assembled. That it is incomplete is accepted and acknowledged. That other names will be yielded through further research, is to be expected. This most important battle will always remain somewhat obscure because of the fact that so many were killed or disabled, that no accurate record was obtained. Inasmuch as the direction of the battle was under the Committee of Safety, and this was soon afterwards absorbed by the new state government and active written returns were either lost or were never committed to writing, the roster which follows has been built up name by name, and under most difficult circumstances. The desire for a complete roster of participants at Oriskany still remains as a task for future historians.

Tryon County Militia, 1st. Regiment.

COL. SAMUEL CAMPBELL.

The first of the four Tryon County Militia regiments is usually known as Campbell's Regiment or as Clyde's Regiment. The territory from which this regiment was drawn was known as the Canajoharie country or precinct and was all the land from the "Noses" to the east, to Little Falls to the west, lying altogether on the south side of the river. Concerning the regiment S. L. Frey in his treatise "The Minute Book of the Committee of Safety" says on pp. 122: "There were two colonels in the first regiment Tryon County Militia, according to 'New York in the Revolution'—Campbell and Ebenezer Cox. The regiment was at Oriskany and Cox being killed, Colonel Campbell was in command and brought off the regiment or what was left of it. He was also colonel of a battalion of Minute Men, presumably a local organization for the protection of Cherry Valley. The family was Scotch-Irish and came to Cherry Valley with several others in 1741, from New Hampshire. In the massacre of Cherry Valley Mrs. Campbell and her four children were among the prisoners and were not exchanged until 1780. Col. Campbell died in 1824, aged 86 years. Judge William W. Campbell, author of the 'Annals of Tryon County' was his grandson. Samuel Clyde was Lt. Colonel but afterwards raised to Colonel. He was a very efficient officer and rendered valuable aid to the cause throughout the war. He was in command at Fort Plain in 1783, when Washington visited the valley. In the massacre at Cherry Valley Col. Clyde escaped by hiding in the woods. He was in the assembly in 1777-8 and sheriff 1785 to 1789.

Col. Jacob Klock's Regiment

Second Tryon County Militia in the Revolution.

In presenting the names of the men in Col. Jacob Klock's Regiment a word of explanation seems necessary in order to avoid confusion and outline the exact scope of the work. It should be borne in mind that this work is confined to but one of the five regiments in Tryon County. In collecting the names the editor has frequently received names which belong to other regiments and these are of course so classified and will be treated at a future time.

In 1772 Sir William Johnson divided Tryon County into five districts after the county was set off from the county of Albany. The districts were as follows: Mohawk, the eastern portions east of "The Noses"; the Palatine district, that portion on the north side of the river from "The Noses" to Little Falls and extending north to the Canadian line; the Canajoharie district on the south side and occupying the same breadth as the Palatine, extending south to the Pennsylvania line; the Kingsland district, that portion on the north side of the river west of the Palatine district and the German Flatts district which was on the south side of the river extending from Little Falls to Fort Stanwix and south to the Pennsylvania line.

The Tryon county committee apparently followed this general division at first but after the death of General Herkimer who was in the Canajoharie district the Kingsland and German Flatts regiments were consolidated and a fifth regiment created embracing Cherry Valley and the section adjacent under Col. Harper. Roberts New York in the Revolution gives the division as follows:

First Regiment—Col. Samuel Campbell, Col. Ebenezer Cox, Lt. Col. Samuel Clyde.

Second Regiment—Col. Jacob Klock, Lt. Col. Peter Wagner.

Third Regiment—Col. Frederick Fisher, Col. Frederick Visscher, Lt. Col. Volkert Veeder.

Fourth Regiment—Col. Peter Bellinger.

Fifth Regiment—Col. John Harper, Major Joseph Harper.

There were also separate divisions as Battalion of Minute Men under Col. Samuel Clyde; Associated Exempts, Capt. Jelles Fonda and four organizations of rangers under Capts. John Wynn, Christian Getman, John Kassellmann and Capt. John Breadbake (Bigbread).

Klock's Regiment is taken largely from New York in the Revolution, a state publication which was issued in 1904. The list of names is from state pay rolls sent in by Col. Jacob Klock and is undoubtedly correct as to those in the regiment subsequent to 1780 when the state government first began to function. Prior to that and especially at the battle of Oriskany when the entire man power of the valley was under arms there were no returns made for the reason that the battle was fought before there was a state government. The only records of those engaged in that battle are those gleaned from pension papers, private papers and family tradition. This has been a work of years and has been engaged in by historians for many years back. The present work is the first attempt to treat the subject by regiments and is far from complete. Recourse has been had to the Oriskany roster of names, as well as Greene's "Gateway to the West" which contains the best roster yet published. We are also indebted to many family historians who have collaborated liberally in preparing this

list. We know that we have fallen way short and that many of those not marked were in the battle of Oriskany. We can only hope that in the fulness of time additional evidence may come to light whereby these men may receive the honor they deserve.

In recording the names as prepared from state pay rolls undoubtedly many repetitions occur. The nature of the service called for many short time services and consequent duplicate pay rolls. The carelessness of army clerks in recording names coupled with the apparent indifference of the men themselves in the matter of spelling often led to duplication of one individual. But on the other hand there were so many of the same name that it is impossible to attempt correction, for fear of robbing some individual of the honor to which he was entitled. The difficulty will be appreciated when we point out that there were during the war three Major Foxes, all bearing nearly the same christian name, two of them being named Christopher and one Christian. Three distinct and separate George Nellises were engaged and there seems to have been at least five Jacob Klocks, all separate individuals. As for Timmerman and Zimmermann, Crouse and Krouse, Failing and Phelan, Dillenbeck and Tillebagh and others there is seemingly a hopeless maze. And yet each of these is capable of separation and in the course of time it is reasonable to expect that many of the heroes will receive just recognition.

In giving the roster of Klock's Regiment the editor is indebted to so many sources that proper acknowledgment by individual name is avoided for fear of omission, but the editor wishes to convey his appreciation to all who have assisted and without such aid frankly admits the task would not even be attempted. The work should not rest here and it is to be hoped that any additional information will be forwarded in order that corrections and additions may be added for a future edition.

Tryon County Militia, 3rd Regiment

Col. Frederick Fisher

The Third Regiment, usually known as Col. Fisher's or Vischer's, was composed of militia from the present east end of the county, or the Mohawk district. This included both sides of the river eastward of the Noses and ran to the county line east of Amsterdam. The men were drawn largely from the Fonda settlement, then Caughnawaga, this being the principal settlement. Owing to the proximity of the Johnsons, this regiment was handicapped by their influence during the early stages of the war. Col. Frederick Fisher stood alone in defiance of the Johnsons at one time. He was born February 22, 1741 and died June 9, 1809. He was Colonel of the Militia during the war. After Johnson deserted Johnstown he was in charge of the fort there. When Sir John Johnson invaded the valley early in 1780 by way of Johnstown his Indians fell on the Fishers and killed and scalped the Colonel and his two brothers, Captain John and Harman. His sisters escaped but the aged mother was struck down by a tomahawk. Both the mother and Col. Fisher recovered. He was afterwards first Judge of Montgomery county common pleas. He was a member of the Committee of Safety for the Mohawk District prior to the outbreak of the war. Lt. Col. Volkert Veeder was a prominent officer. He was Lt. Col. of the 5th Albany Militia and then of the Third Tryon County Militia. His name appears to be spelled both Veeder and Vedder. There were seventy-five men in the service by the name Veeder and Vedder.
